Bristol City Council are currently working up a bid to Cycling England, applying to become a Cycling Demonstration City. This demonstration status would see £10 per head of population being invested in cycling in the city over the coming three years.

I invite you to share your views on what changes you would like to see delivered over the next three years to transform cycling should we win the bid.
